BSX #3 - Prayer

Sustained and concentrated growth in Godliness by the quality and quantity of your prayers

BSX #4 - Fasting

Sustained and concentrated growth in Godliness by the quality and frequency of fasting

BSX #5 - Worship

Sustained and concentrated growth in Godliness by the quality and frequency of genuine worship

BSX #6 - Stewardship

Sustained and concentrated growth in Godliness by the quality of my oversight of the income, management, spending and giving of my finances
