Of this man's seed hath God according to his promise raised unto Israel a Saviour, Jesus: (Acts 13:22-23)

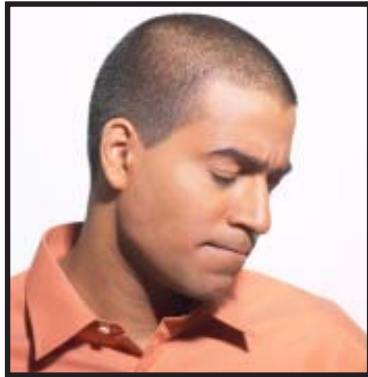

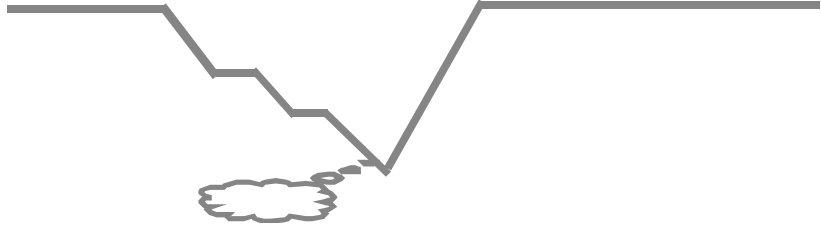

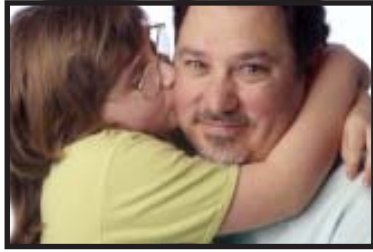
