The Law of Unintended Consequences

- 1. Positive, in which case we get serendipity (Serendipity is finding something unexpected and useful while searching for something else entirely.)
- 2. Negative: perverse effect, which is the opposite result to the one intended

What has consequences?

- 3. Each and every action we take
- 4. Each and every motive of our heart

What Activates The Law of Unintended Consequences?

- 1. When we sin
- 2. When we disregard any Word or principle of God
- 3. When we violate God's established priorities
- 4. When we don't count the cost
- 5. When we disregard the laws of sowing & reaping

The Laws of Harvest (Sowing & Reaping)

- 1. I will reap what I sow
- 2. I will reap more than I sow
- 3. I will reap where I sow
- 4. Though I sow in secret the harvest will be visible


